Mr. Anderson, 56, has served as an executive vice presiden: since 1966, and has been responsible for bringing new plants into operation in the U.S. Virgin Islands, Taiwan and West Germany. I addition, he directs the

Mr. Anderson is also responsible for the William L. Langer Jewel Bearing Plant, in Rolla, N. D., the nation's sole producer of jewel bearings, which is operated by Bulova for the U. S. Government's General Services Administration.

He began his career with Bulova as an industrial engineer, was premoted to director of standards in 1945, to production manager, in Providence, in 1949, and to factory manager in Providence in 1954. He was named a vice president in 1957.

. Mr. Anderson, a resident of Providence, R. I., continues as executive vice president.

Mr. Bourquin: 52, a Canadian citizen, first joined Bulova's subsidiary in Canada, Bulova Watch Company Limited (Toront:), as a watchmaker, after working as a watch technician in recail jewelry stores. In 1943, he joined the Royal Canadian Navy, and served aboard a Corvette on convoy duty in the North Acantic. He rejoined the company in 1946, as a watchmaker, and in 1950 was promoted to Chief Watchmaker. The same year he was named manager of the subsidiary's watch material sales division, and in that capacity travelled c.ntinually throughout Canada, calling on jewelers.

In 1954, Mr. Bourquin was appointed Bu'ova sales representative for the Canadian Maritime Provinces and 130 Newfoundland. In 1956 he was promoted to international sales manager in charge of exports to British Comm nwealth markets. During this period he also served on the Board of Examiners of the Watchmakers Division of Canadian Jewellers Institute.

In 1960, Mr. Bourquin was named a vice president of Bulova International, a new marketing subsidiary. In 1961, he was assigned responsibility for developing new Far East markets. In that post, Mr. Bourouin headquartered in Hong Kong, and developed the first Buleva retail networks in Singapore, Malaysia, Japan, the Philippines, Australia, New Zealand Taiwan, Okinawa, Korea, Indonesia and Thailand.
